The sixth volume of the Bibliothèque copte de Nag Hammadi's "Concordances" series presents the concordance of codex X and the beginning of codex XI. From codex X the concordance contains the tractate entitled *Marsanes* and from codex XI, the *Interpretation of Knowledge*, the *Valentinian Exposition*, and the liturgical texts appended to the latter. These texts have been included in the same volume for linguistic reasons. Along with the concordance of codex I, already published in this collection, the present volume gives access to all of the Nag Hammadi texts written in the Coptic dialect known as L6. To complete this corpus, it is necessary to add the Brit. Lib. Or. 4926(1) fragments that contain a version of the *Tractate without Title (On the Origin of the World)*, written in the same dialect. The establishment of the lemmes, the arrangement of the occurrences, and the constitution of the volume conform to the model established for the first, third, and fifth volumes of the concordance series. Therefore, a "List of Textual Criticism" will be found preceding the concordance itself, a list extremely useful for the editorial history of these particular texts.
