This work includes seven already published studies and one previously unpublished study, all of which are dedicated to Athenagoras of Alexandria and concern the following subjects: the testimony of the *Codex Baroccianus* about Athenagoras and the origins of the *didaskaleion* of Alexandria; the authenticity of Athenagoras' *De resurrectione*; *De resurrectione* in the face of Valentinian gnosis; Athenagoras and Tertullian on the resurrection; the "food chain" argument in *De resurrectione*; scriptural citations in Athenagoras; the editions of Athenagoras printed in the 16th- and 17th-centuries; and Athenagoras' place in Christian thought. The work concludes with a bibliography of studies concerning the Greek apologists and Athenagoras of Alexandria in particular. As the author of an important monograph dedicated to Athenagoras (Paris, Beauchesne, 1989), Professor Pouderon has also published an edition of the *Supplique au sujet des Chrétiens* and the *Traité sur la résurrection des morts* of Athenagoras (Paris, Cerf, 1992).
